The *Betley* comes from Betley in Staffordshire, runs by Doddington, Wybunbury, and Bartherton, and falls into the Weever.¹¹

22:653 [12 May 1310]

Richard de Shavington, who was languishing under some fleeting illness, fell into some water at Shavington and was accidentally drowned.

The event was reported to the coroner of Wych Malbanc hundred on behalf of the four townships, Shavington, Rope, Coppenhall and Basford, who paid a shilling each not to have to attend.
