Warin le Grosvenor

The accounts of Guncelin de Badelsmere for the issues of Chester and Cheshire from 29 September 1274 to 29 September 1275 (E 372/120) include:²⁸

Et de .xxxiij.lj'.vj.s'. & viij.d'. de fir^a aduocar' p id'. temp^s. p manu' Warini le grouenur.

His accounts for the following year (Michaelmas 1275 to Michaelmas 1276) (E 372/121) include:

Et de xxxiij.li' vj.s.viij den'. de fir^a aduocar' p idem temp^s.

The amount, £33 6s 8d, being identical year to year suggests a set farm paid by the keeper. Warin le Grosvenor figures prominently in the earliest surviving plea rolls, but these survive, in the main, from a little later, 1281 onwards.²⁹
