A most important episcopal possession within the shire was the manor of Tarvin, which supported a prebend in Lichfield cathedral. In 1287 we find the brother Robert de Valle Regali (Vale Royal) undertaking to deliver his accounts on 22 July 1287 for the period when he served as the bishop's bailiffs for all his lands in Cheshire.
