

Geoffrey del Oaks

Adam son of Thomas de Bosco (Wood) sued Benedict de Bickerton for having seized a plough of his on Saturday 26 September 1299 at Hatton in a place called Geffreysfeld and moved it to the house of one Geoffrey del Oaks, and kept it there until it was recovered by the royal bailiff.

Ralph le Butler accused Simon Bonkyn of having disseised him of a messuage in Coddington, and the jury found in his favour. Simon had been attached by Simon de Clutton and Geoffrey del Oaks.
