

## Bailiffs of Peckforton

At this period the manor of Peckforton was in the hands of the family of de Sancto Petro (Sanpierre). .

### Richard de Fowlhurst

A quarrel arose between Urien de Sancto Petro, lord of Peckforton, and Richard de Fowlhurst his bailiff there. Urien claimed that Richard had broken an agreement they had made about two messuages, 28 acres of (arable) land, 1½ acres of meadow and the sixth part of a mill in Wych Malbanc (Nantwich) and Acton; and that Richard had not accounted to him for the time that Richard had been his bailiff in his manor of Peckforton and all his other lands in Cheshire.

Richard came to court, an agreement was reached, and Urien dropped the charge about the accounts.
