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THE SANCTO PETRO SHARE OF SHIPBROOK

Urian de Sancto Petro (Sanpierre) died seised in his own right of a sixth part of Shipbrook barony, as recorded by inquisitions in 1295 and 1298.

*Chester. Inq. made at Torperlegh on Thursday after SS. Perpetua and Felicitas, 23 Edw. I.*²⁴⁵

Malpas (in Malo Passu). A fourth part of the barony, the pourparty of Idonea late his wife, daughter and one of the heirs of David de Malo Passu, held by the courtesy of England of the king in chief, including:—

Malpas. A carucate of land, a fourth part of the advowson of the church, and a court of free tenants.

Cudington. A fourth part of the manor.

Malpas. 66s. 5¼d. yearly rent, and a fourth part of the serjeanty of the barony.

Fulwich (Fulwico). 6l. 10s. yearly rent.

All held as above by service of 1½ knight's fee.

Chester County. A moiety of the serjeanty of the peace held of the king in chief, by the courtesy of England of the inheritance of the aforesaid Idonea, by service of finding ten serjeants to keep the peace in the county, for which he ought to receive 30s. at the exchequer of Chester for the cloaks (mantellis) of the said serjeants.

Anderton. The manor held of the king in chief by service of 1lb. pepper payable at the exchequer of Chester.

Shipbrok, Davenham and Leftewyk. A sixth part of the manors held of the king in chief.

Hurdeleston. A ninth part of the manor.

Pycketon. A sixth part of the manor, whereof he was enfeoffed jointly with Margaret his wife, to them and the heirs of their bodies with remainder to the heirs of the said Urian.

Nantwich (de Wico Malb'). An eighteenth part of the barony with an eighteenth part of the wood of Couuel, and an eighteenth part of the serjeanty of the barony, and of the passagia of Brunneshurst and Swanesbach, whereof he was similarly enfeoffed.

Acton. A sixth part of the manor, whereof he was similarly enfeoffed.

All held of the king in chief by service of a knight's fee.

Torperle, Keleshall and Masefen. The passagium held of the king in chief by service of guarding the roads in the times of the fair (nundinarum) of Chester.

Barton. 3s. 8d. rent receivable from David de Barton for a mill.

Le Maupas. A burgage and 4a. land.

Le Fulwich. Two saltpits.

Both tenements held of Richard de Sutton by service of 21d.

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Pecforton. The manor held, by the courtesy of England of the inheritance of the aforesaid Idonea, of Urian son of John and David son of Richard by service of 3s. yearly.

Horslegh. A moiety of the manor with a pourparty of the mill of Beston, held of the same Urian and Richard and Roger de Wolaston and Margery his wife by service of 18d. yearly.

Ridele. A carucate of land held of the prior of the Hospital of St John of Jerusalem in England by service of 12d.

Sporstowe and Halghton. A carucate of land held of the divers parceners . . . unknown by service of a rose.

Ridele, Sporstowe and Halgton. A twelfth part of the manors held of [Hova ap (?)] Eygnon, by service of 1d.

Fadyle. 12a. land held of Henry del Boure . . .

Nantwich (Wico Malb'). A saltpit and a moiety of a saltpit held of Robert de Preers by service of 12d.

Aldelime. 2s. rent receivable yearly by the hands of Roger de Clutton.

Chester. 2s. (?) rent receivable yearly from Randolph de Deresbury, and a pair of gloves from the heirs of John Noble.

[Cherlton?] A third part of the manor, which is held of Robert de Preers by service of 6d., whereof he was enfeoffed jointly with Margaret his wife, to them and the heirs of their bodies, with remainder to the heirs of the said . . . ; the said Margaret remains seised thereof as jointly enfeoffed.

Urian, son of John son . . . heir of the above-named Idonea, aged 16 on the feast of St Dunstan, is next heir of the said Urian.

Mandate under the privy seal to John de Langeton, the chancellor, to do what ought to be done under the great seal according to law &c.,

. . . Basset to whom the king has granted the marriage of Margaret, late the wife of the said Urian, having done the fealty due to the king, 21 June, 23 Edw. I.²⁴⁶

Chester. Inq. Monday the feast of the Decollation of St. John the Baptist, 23 Edw. I.²⁴⁷

Malpas. A fourth part of the barony held of the king in chief, by the courtesy of England of the inheritance of Idonea sometime his wife, by service of 1½ knight's fee.

Shipbrok. A sixth part of the barony held of the king in chief by service of ½ knight's fee.

Nantwich (Wich Malbano). An eighteenth part of the barony held of the king in chief by service of ½ knight's fee.

Chester County. A moiety of the serjeanty of the peace, held of the king in chief by the courtesy of England as aforesaid, by service of finding 10 serjeants for keeping the peace in the said county.

Anderton. The manor held of the king in chief in free socage by service of 1lb. pepper.

Thorperle [alias Thorperleg] and Keleshal [alias Kelsale]. A certain passagium in the time of the fair of Chester, held of the king in chief, worth 18d. yearly.

Pekferton [alias Pecforton]. The manor held in free socage of the heirs [alias the lords] of Bunnebury by service of 3s. [alias 2s.] yearly.

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Ridleghe [alias Rydeleg]. A carucate of land held in free socage of the prior of the Hospital of St John of Jerusalem in England by service of 1d. yearly.

Sporstowe and Halgton [alias Halghton]. A carucate of land held in free socage of Roger de Sporstowe and his parceners, lords of Sporstowe and Halgton, by service of a rose yearly.

Ridleghe [alias Rydeleg], Sporstowe and Halghton. A twelfth part of the lordship held in free socage of Hova son of Eygnun [alias Eignon] by service of 1d. yearly.

Fadilegh. 7a. land held in free socage of Henry de la [alias del] Boure by service of a rose yearly.

Cherlton. A third part held in free socage of Robert de Praeres [alias de Prieers] by service of 6d. yearly.

Nantwich. Two saltpits held in free socage of the same Robert by service of 12d. yearly.

Horsleghe. A mill and a half held in free socage of Roger de Wollaueston [alias de Wolaston] and David de Bunnebury [alias David son of Richard de Bonnebury] by service of 18d. yearly.

Malpas. Two burgages, and two saltpits in Fulwich, held in free socage of Richard de Sutton by service of 21d. and a pair of gloves (sorothecarum) yearly.

Urian, son of John de Sancto Petro son of Urian aforesaid and heir of the aforesaid Idonea, aged 16 at the feast of St. Dunstan last, is next heir of Urian aforesaid. And before the same jury, Margaret late the wife of the said Urian was dowered by the king's writ, of 6l. from the portion of Shipbrok held of the king, of 4l. from the portion of the eighteenth part of the barony of Nantwich, and of 10l. from the third part of Cherlton.

Writ to the justice of Chester, with the escheator to enquire what lands &c. the said Urian held &c. on the day he died, and return the inquisition to the treasurer &c. of the exchequer, 18 Feb. 28 Edw. I.²⁴⁸

Chester. Inq. made at Chester on Wednesday after St. Augustine the Bishop, 28 Edw. I.²⁴⁹

Malpas. A fourth part of the barony, &c.

In February 1296, Ralph and Margaret Basset sued Urian son of John de Sancto Petro, John de Grey and Richard de Fowlshurst for disseisin of Margaret's free tenements: nine messuages, 2 carucates and 12 acres of (arable) land, 4 acres of meadow and woodland in Chorlton juxta Wybunbury; 16 acres in the Hough, a third part of the manor of Picton with a sixth part of a water mill in the same township; an eighteenth part of the serjeanty of Wych Malbanc; an 18th part of the water mills in the same town; 7s rent in the same town; 16 acres of woodland in Cowel; an 18th part of the passages of Brunshurst and Swansbach; and part of the manor of Acton juxta Wych Malbanc.

Urian the defendant replied that Urian his grandfather gave all the premises to his son John before himself going overseas to the Holy Land; when he returned John returned the lands to him to hold at will, but the ownership of the property remained in John. Ralph and Margaret never had possession of these lands.

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Ralph and Margaret said that Margaret and Urian senior had been jointly enfeoffed with the premises and that after Urian senior's death the whole of the property remained to her. The jury rejected this claim.

Ralph and Margaret also sued John de Grey, keeper of the lands and heir of Urian de Sancto Petro for dower of third parts of the manors of Audlem, Shipbrook, Davenham, Toftwich, of a sixth part of the manor of Hurleston, of a carucate of land in Haughton, Sprostow and Ridley, and of a 12th part of two water mills and of 40 acres of land in the same townships. John said that Urian did not hold these premises when he married Margaret, nor ever thereafter: the jury agreed.
