Ranulfus comes Cestrie constabulario suo et dapifero, iusticiario, vic', baronibus et ballivis et omnibus hominibus suis salutem. Sciatis me concessisse et reddidisse et hac carta mea confirmasse Roberto filio Roberti de Stokeport tanquam ius suum et hereditatem Merpel et Wibreslegam cum omnibus pertinentiis suis in bosco et plano, in pratis et pasturis, in viis et semitis, et aquis et mariscis, et in omnibus rebus eisdem terris pertinentibus, et terram quam Walterus de predicto Roberto tenuit in Upton, et unum burgagium in Macclefeld, habenda et tenenda dicto Roberto et heredibus suis de me et heredibus meis in feodo et hereditate libere et quiete et integre per servicium forestarie pro omni servicio, salvis mihi et heredibus meis aeiriis accipitrum et nisorum et falconum et venacione in boscis ad predictas terras pertinentibus/ Et predictus Robertus et heredes sui et eorum homines habebunt sibi necessaria in predictis boscis sine visitatione et destructione foreste mee.
