The borough of Stockport was a liberty within another liberty, the hundred of Macclesfield: very few cases concerning property in the town were brought to the county court.

Emma who was wife of Robert de Knangreave sued Hugh son of Robert de Esthall for a third part, as dower, of a messuage and a carucate of land in Stockport. Hugh called to warrant Richard de Stockport.
