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Robert de Radswell

Jordan de Winburn's successor as archdeacon of Chester was Robert de Radswell, the rector of Davenham. Davenham was a large and valuable parish, containing the modern townships of Bostock, Davenham, Eaton, Leftwich, Moulton, Newhall, Rudheath Lordship, Shipbrook, Shurlach, Stanthornem Wharton and Whatcroft. The tithes of this rich agricultural area were a valuable property; and, being a rectory, the parish had not been stripped of its great tithes. We find Radswell in 1287 having sold all his corn, both in his granges in Bostock and Davenham, and outside, and sir Richard de Massey, William de Brickhill and Robert de Hemington entered into this recognizance to pay Radswell £60 in silver.

Radswell brought an unsuccessful suit against John de Orreby and others for having kept a hawk of his: he was amerced for making a false claim, but, as usually in dealing with people of influence, the court waived the amercement and he was not required to give pledges.

By December 1290 Radswell had been appointed archdeacon, and started rebuilding his church at Davenham, with stone from a quarry in Delamere forest.

To Reginald de Grey, justice of Chester. Order to permit master Robert de Radewell, archdeacon of Chester, to whom the king has granted three hundred stones in his quarry within the forest of La Mare for the fabric of the chancel of Robert's church of Davenham, to quarry (findere) the aforesaid stones and to carry them whither he will.

The following March Radswell received a papal dispensation to retain both the rectory and the archdeaconry 'which has no house of residence'.

Dispensation to Ralph de Creppinge, who has held the churches of Brokedis, Hethille, and Coulinge, in the diocese of Norwich, without papal dispensation, their united incomes amounting to no more than 49l., to retain the same ; a portion of the fruits received being applied to the said churches.

The like, at the king's request, to master William de Sancto Botulpho, in regard to the churches of Northolingham, West Horsele, and Haueton or Houeton, in the dioceses of Durham, York, and Winchester.

The like to master Robert de Redwellis, in regard to the church of Davenham, and the archdeaconry of Chester, which has no house of residence.

The *Taxatio Ecclesiastica* of pope Nicholas IV, made in about 1291, valued Davenham church at £20 *per annum*. In practice Radswell was extracting far more than this, in tithes alone.

In July 1292 the king ordered the justice of Chester to let Radswell have six bucks from Delamere, and twenty oaks from Lightwood for his building work.

Davenham tithes gave Radswell a steady stream of revenue. In March 1293 Warin de Standon and Richard Starky enter into a recognizance that they owe him £10 for the tithes of Bostock.

Radswell payed a tenth to the Crown in 1295, and at the end of the year was preparing to travel abroad.

In August 1296, Radswell received recognizances from William de Bulkeley and Roger de Moulton (7 marks), William de Bostock, Hugh de Bostock and Gilbert son of William de Bostock (15 marks), Gilbert Dodfyn, Hugh le Tew, Ranulph his brother and Hugh le Tew junior (16 marks) and Gilbert Dodfyn and Robert Ellis (11 marks 10 shillings), for £33 3s 4d, doubtless for Davenham tithes.

At the same court, royal letters of protection for Radswell, dated 7 April, and lasting to 1 November following, were enrolled. In March 1298, in preparation for the Scottish campaign, the king summoned him to Westminster to attend his council in person.

The bishop of Chester, Coventry and Lichfield, Roger de Meuland, died 16 December 1295, leaving Radswell, Roger de Aston and Elias de Napton his executors.

Magister John Lovel sued Roger de Aston, Elyas de Napton, and Robert de Redeswell, the executors of Roger formerly bishop of Coventry and Lichfield, for 62 marks owing to him, the arrears of an annual rent of 6 marks, which the said bishop had engaged to pay to him so long as he conducted the bishop's business as advocate in the court of Canterbury by a deed dated 1283, which he produced. The executors denied that John had carried out the conditions of the deed, and the case was adjourned to the quindene of Trinity at York.

Magister Andrew de Esseburæ sued magister Elias de Napton archdeacon of Derby, magister Robert de Radeswell archdeacon of Chester, and Roger de Aston, executors of Roger formerly bishop of Coventry and Lichfield, for £50. Adjourned to the octaves of St John the Baptist at York.

In July 1298 Fulk de Meols, Robert de Bebington, John Dennis, Thomas Bernard, Richard de Kirby clerk and Ralph de Puddington entered into a recognizance with Radswell in 63 marks (£42) for the tithe sheaves of West Kirby church. At the same time the archdeacon's serjeant, Reginald de Kirby joined Fulk, Robert and Richard in 63s 4d (4 marks 10 shillings) to St Werburgh's abbey for the tithes of the demesnes of Kirby.

At the following court, 11 August 1299, three more recognizances are registered. Roger de Moulton, Ranulph le Tew, Hugh le Tew, Ralph le Ward, Richard de Balshaw and Hamon de Bostock recognized 8 marks (£5 3s 4d) due to Radswell for the tithes of Moulton and Eaton; Hugh le Tew, Gilbert Dodfyn and Ranulph le Tew 4½ marks (£3) for the tithes of Waverton; and Ralph le Ward, Philip the clerk of Bostock, Ralph le Tew, Roger de Moulton, Hugh de Moulton, Hugh le Tew and Richard de Balshaw 12 marks (£8) for the tithes of Stanthorne. The repetition of the names indicates an organized farming of tithes, not merely individual tenants making monetary payments; and the values give an idea of agricultural prosperity. It is only in some years that the clerks indicate in the text of the recognizances the nature of the debt — whether for past or future tithes, crops, &c. Recognizances in July or August usually relate to tithes. Only occasionally are the debts marked as cancelled on payment, though doubtless virtually all were duly paid.

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After 1301 recognizances are recorded less frequently on the county plea rolls, but are registered in the Recognizance Rolls: but the business of enforcing collection of debts remained a subject of the pleas. In February 1302 William de Venables, Katherine his wife and Richard Crede were accused of having offered violence to Henry de Darnhall when he tried to execute the earl of Chester's writ. It was stated that William de Venables owed the archdeacon of Chester a certain sum, which he had guaranteed by a recognizance. Venables having failed to repay, the sheriff sent his serjeant, Ranulph (*sic*) de Darnhall, to distrain Venables; Ranulph took some beasts, and was going to drive them off when Crede prevented him. In court Richard de Sharesworth, a bailiff of the Constable, said that Crede was in the Constable's avowry, and claimed him: but the justice said that in a case where violence and resistance had been offered to a servant of the earl, the culprit could not take advantage of any liberty by *twertnic*. William de Hesketh, the Constable's steward, then intervened and asked for an adjournment.

In July 1306 Giles son of Richard Lengineer sued Richard Lengineer to warrant to him a messuage and 2 bovates of land in Pulford which Robert son of Hugh de Pulford was claiming from him. Robert claimed that he had inherited the property from his kinsman Ralph son of Robert de Pulford, who had been seised of it in the time of Henry III (1216-1272). Ralph had died without issue, so it had descended to his brother Robert, and from Robert to Robert's father Hugh.

Richard Lengineer came to court, with Agnes his wife, and called Richard son of Ralph de Pulford to warrant. Richard son of Ralph said that he had entered the property as son and heir of Ralph (son of Robert). Robert son of Hugh said Richard son of Ralph's claim was invalid because Richard was a bastard. That being a matter for a church court, notice was sent to the archdeacon to call an inquiry. The archdeacon's reply is, unfortunately, damaged, but appears to indicate that Richard's mother was a certain Matilda de L.....

Robert de Pulford then sued Richard and Agnes Lengineer, saying that although he had demised a bovat of land in Pulford to them, he had done so when he was under age, and so the contract was invalid. He also sued them and Richard son of Ralph de Pulford for having taken the previous case to a church court over land which was a lay fee.

Shortly before the death of Edward I (7 July 1307), Radswell was attached to answer the earl of Chester (shortly to become Edward II) on a charge that he, by his servants and ministers, had been committing usury by

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selling crops at above their true value. Radswell claimed twertnic, and the earl of Lincoln as Constable of Chester claimed Radswell for his liberty by twertnic. The *sectatores* of the court were questioned as to this procedure: they said that the justiciar by virtue of his office could allow that custom to anyone should he desire just as all previous justiciars had done. So, for the moment, Radswell was released *sine die*.

Ormerod (i 88, citing Cowper and Willis) claimed that Radswell died at Lichfield 13 June 1314 (Fasti ii 566); but seven years preceding had resigned [the archdeaconry] to John Marcell, prebendary of St John's in Chester: the latter conflicts with the plea rolls showing Radswell as archdeacon in December 1309, and with Browne Willis himself (i 412): Robert de Raddeswill, LL.D. held it 1289. and died possess'd of it at Lichfeild, June 13. 1314.
